INTRODUCTION

“I KNOW I SHOULD PRAY FOR MY KIDS, BUT I DON’T KNOW WHAT TO SAY...”

After years in ministry and the military, nothing’s stretched me more than learning to pray for my own kid. Praying for your child is one of the most important ways to lead them spiritually—but it’s not always easy to know what to say. This 30-day prayer guide provides meaningful themes, Scripture, and crafted prayers to help you speak life over your children. Rooted in God’s Word, this book is a practical tool to inspire intentional, powerful prayers that bless your child and align your heart with God’s will for their life.

One of the most gut-wrenching stories in the Bible is in Genesis 27—when Isaac blesses his son Jacob. It’s a powerful moment with a prayer full of purpose:

“May God give you heaven’s dew and earth’s richness... Let nations serve you... Cursed be those who curse you and blessed be those who bless you.”
— Genesis 27:27–29

It’s an epic prayer—bold, intentional, and full of destiny. But here’s the twist: Isaac thought he was praying over his firstborn, Esau. Instead, Jacob tricked him. When Esau found out, he begged:

“Bless me—me too, my father!” — Genesis 27:34

But Isaac had nothing left to give. The blessing had already been spoken—and it mattered. It wasn’t just tradition. It was spiritual, weighty, real.

This hits me differently now that I’m about to be a dad. My wife and I are expecting our first—Baby Z. I’ve prayed for her since before her heart beat for the first time. And now, I want to pray with the same intentionality Isaac did—just without the deception and drama!

But I’ve noticed something: sometimes I run out of words. I fall back on safe prayers—“keep her healthy; keep her safe.” Important, yes—but also incomplete. Isaac’s prayer wasn’t about safety. It was about identity, legacy, and calling.

Here’s the good news: we’re not limited like Isaac. We don’t have just one blessing to give. Through Jesus, we’ve got an endless supply. Every child can be covered in prayer—specific, personal, powerful prayers.

Dads, this is especially for us. We’re called to protect and provide—but also to pray. Prayer isn’t a bonus; it’s part of your armor. You wouldn’t send your family into a storm without covering them. So don’t send them into the world without prayer.

Let’s be intentional. Let’s pray bold blessings over our kids. Not just for who they are now, but for who God is calling them to be. Because every word we speak over them shapes their future.

And what could matter more than that?

DAY 1

A PRAYER FOR THEIR WORDS

Those who guard their mouths and their tongues keep themselves from calamity. — Proverbs 21:23

Don't use foul or abusive language. Let everything you say be good and helpful, so that your words will be an encouragement to those who hear them. — Ephesians 4:29

A good person produces good things from the treasury of a good heart, and an evil person produces evil things from the treasury of an evil heart. What you say flows from what is in your heart. — Luke 6:45

WHAT TO PRAY:

Lord Almighty, I thank You for gifting me with the responsibility and honor to be my child's parent. I thank You for this beautiful child. Today I take a moment to pray for their mouth and their words. Father, I pray that they would be a person that guards their mouth and tongue so they may be kept from experiencing calamity. I pray that they would not use their words to gossip, deceive, or cause division. Instead, I declare that they will use their mouth to encourage all those around them. I pray that their words would be used to bless others. Even when faced with people who seek to harm them, I pray that they would meet unkind words with words of healing. I pray that they would be bold to speak the truth and gracious to do so with love. And God, I pray that you would guard their heart. Because from the heart, the mouth speaks. Will You fill their heart with Your word and with Your presence so that when they speak, You speak through them. Thank You God. I love my child but I know You love them more. I trust You with their life and their well-being. Amen.

DAY 2

A PRAYER FOR THEIR HEALTH

For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well. — Psalm 139:13-14

WHAT TO PRAY:

God, I thank You once more for the gift of life. Thank You for the miracle named _____. They are precious. As I come before Your presence today, I ask for their health. Lord, You have knit them together in their mother's womb. They are handcrafted by You: their eyes, their ears, their lips, their hands, their feet, their legs, their brain, their organs. All of it is evidence of Your brilliance, and You don't make mistakes. They have been fearfully and wonderfully made. And yet, I worry for their health—not because I have reason to but because I love them and don't want them to ever suffer. I ask to seek comfort for myself and to spare them of any pain or discomfort. Will you keep them healthy, O God? I pray for their physical health, their spiritual health, and their mental health. I pray against all diseases, even those that are “genetically” passed from one generation to the next. God I know You're faithful. Help me be faithful in trusting You and Your capable and loving hands. Thank You God. I love _____, but I know You love them more. I trust You with their life and their well-being. Amen.

DAY 3

A PRAYER FOR THEIR FRIENDSHIPS

Whoever walks with the wise becomes wise, but the companion of fools will suffer harm. — Proverbs 13:20

A man of many companions may come to ruin, but there is a friend who sticks closer than a brother. — Proverbs 18:24

Oil and perfume make the heart glad, and the sweetness of a friend comes from his earnest counsel. — Proverbs 27:9

***Do not be deceived: “Bad company ruins good morals.”
— 1 Corinthians 15:33***

WHAT TO PRAY:

God, I pray for my child's friendships. I pray Lord that You would surround them with friends, classmates, neighbors, and future coworkers that would be filled with wisdom. I pray that You would protect them and keep them from surrounding themselves with people who are foolish and may lead them astray. I pray that You would give them the ability to discern between those who are wise and those who are foolish. I pray that they would be a wise friend to others, and that they wouldn't lead others astray. I ask God that You would set aside those who will one day become their their confidants—that my child would not only benefit from their counsel, but that their friends would benefit from their counsel as well. Thank you God for answered prayers, I trust You with my child and recognize you love them more than I ever could. Amen.

DAY 4

A PRAYER FOR THEIR EARS

Faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

— Romans 10:17

Make your ear attentive to wisdom and incline your heart to understanding. — Proverbs 2:2

WHAT TO PRAY:

Heavenly Father, may _____'s ears always be attuned to Your voice. I pray that they would be sensitive to whatever it is that You may want to communicate to them. I pray for them to have a supernatural and heightened awareness for whatever it is You may want to speak to them. I pray that they would hear You with clarity. Let them hear Your truth and reject the lies of the enemy. May they hear Your Word and grow in faith every day. Help them to seek wisdom and for their hearts to be fertile ground for Your Word. Help them to develop a sense for what they should and shouldn't listen to. That they would guard their ears from deceit, gossip, slander, and anything else that can corrupt their mind, their heart, and their spirit. God, thank You for giving me my child. I give them right back to You. Amen.

DAY 5

A PRAYER FOR THEIR EYES

Open my eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of Your law.

— Psalm 119:18

The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light. — Matthew 6:22

I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people, and his incomparably great power for us who believe. — Ephesians 1:17-19

WHAT TO PRAY:

Lord, bless _____'s eyes to see clearly, both physically and spiritually. I pray for Your protection over what they choose to consume visually. I also pray for Your protection over what they may be exposed to seeing without a choice. More importantly, I ask that You would open their eyes to who You are. That they would see Your creation and that You would reveal Yourself to them through the heavens, the earth, wildlife, and all the other beautiful things Your hands created. I ask that their eyes would be opened to the truth of Your Word whenever they read it. Like Your Word says in Ephesians, I pray that the eyes of their heart may be enlightened so that they may know the hope to which You have called them, the riches of Your inheritance for them, and the great power You have given them once they believe in You. May they see Your hand in their lives. Amen.

DAY 6

A PRAYER FOR THEIR MINDS

Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. — Philippians 4:8

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect. — Romans 12:2

WHAT TO PRAY:

Father, protect _____'s mind from fear. I pray that they would remember that they are more than conquerors in Christ. I pray that You would protect them from doubting whether or not You love them or have forgiven them. Remind them that there is nothing and no one that can separate them from the love of Christ. I pray that You would protect their minds from negativity and that they would fix their minds on You. Fill them with thoughts that are true, noble, and pure. And Father, I ask that Your Spirit would renew their minds so that their thoughts lead them closer to You. I pray these things in Your name, Amen.

DAY 7

A PRAYER FOR THEM TO SEEK GOD

But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you. — Matthew 6:33

***You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart.
— Jeremiah 29:13***

He who dwells in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty. I will say of the LORD, 'He is my refuge and my fortress; My God, in Him I will trust.' — Psalm 91:1-2

WHAT TO PRAY:

God, I pray that my child seeks You first in every decision and every moment of their life. My desire is that whenever they think or say to themselves, "I want to do _____," that they will pause long enough to wonder what Your will might be for their life. I pray that they get to know You so well-that it becomes second nature for them to filter their decisions and desires through what most pleases You, and I ask that Your favor would rest upon them as a result of it. Help others notice and recognize that there is something different about them, and that those people would come to realize that it is Your presence that has set my child apart. Bless them with the opportunity to walk and talk with You as if You were their friend. May they trust in You always. Amen.

DAY 8

A PRAYER FOR THEIR SCHOOLS

For He will command His angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways. — Psalm 91:11

For the Lord gives wisdom; from His mouth come knowledge and understanding. — Proverbs 2:6

WHAT TO PRAY:

Father, I worry sometimes about the place where my child spends so much of their day. I humbly ask for Your divine protection over their school. I pray not only for their physical safety but also their emotional safety. I pray specifically for my child's sense of identity and belonging. Would You anchor them in the truth of who they are in You and not in who others may say they are. I bless their classmates and pray that they would come to know Christ through my child's example. And when my child inevitably fails in any way, I ask that Your grace would abound and that they wouldn't define themselves by their worst moments. I also say a prayer for their teachers and administrators—would You give them the wisdom to lead their school well and to facilitate an environment where children can learn safely? Thank You for hearing this prayer. Amen.

DAY 9

A PRAYER FOR THE GIFTS THAT GOD HAS GIVEN THEM

Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms.

— 1 Peter 4:10

We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us.

— Romans 12:6

WHAT TO PRAY:

God, I thank You for the gifts that You have given my child. Though I may not know exactly what those are or have the ability to appreciate them yet, I thank You. I know that in due time, You will reveal Your gifts to them, and I just ask that they'd be able to recognize those as coming straight from You. Father, protect them from ever becoming prideful or arrogant in their giftedness, but I ask instead that they would give You all the glory for it. Help them to be faithful to the calling You've entrusted them with. Give them the strength to never use their talents for selfish gain. Thank You because they are a gift that You have given me. Amen.

DAY 10

A PRAYER FOR FAVOR WHEREVER THEY GO

A note on favor: What is the “favor” of the Lord? You may have heard this term before, and you may wonder what that means. Many have misinterpreted it to mean success, and typically we define that through money, careers, and all the other things we value in society. However, biblically speaking, God’s favor simply refers to an undeniable sense that God approves of someone. And Scripture is clear, favor belongs to those who favor God. If you want God to favor your kids, model for them what it looks like for you to love God.

Surely, Lord, You bless the righteous; You surround them with Your favor as with a shield. — Psalm 5:12

My son, do not forget my teaching, but keep my commands in your heart, for they will prolong your life many years and bring you peace and prosperity. Let love and faithfulness never leave you; bind them around your neck, write them on the tablet of your heart. So you will find favor and good success in the sight of God and man.

— Proverbs 3:4

These are the ones I look on with favor: those who are humble and contrite in spirit, and who tremble at my word. — Isaiah 66:2

WHAT TO PRAY:

God, create within my child an unending desire to know You, to honor You, and to love You with all their heart, soul, and strength. Surround them with Your favor like a shield. Amen.

DAY 11

A PRAYER FOR THEIR HEART

Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it.

— Proverbs 4:23

And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you.

— Ezekiel 36:26

WHAT TO PRAY:

Lord, I pray for my child's heart. I pray for the day on which they will make a choice to follow You with all their heart. Make that an unmistakable moment that they will never forget. Grant them the wisdom to recognize that their heart will not always lead them in the right direction. I pray that You'd help them to understand the difference between being led by Your Spirit and being led by their desires and emotions. God protect them from ever mistaking one of those for the other. Sharpen their will to guard their hearts from people and other influences that may corrupt their character. May their hearts remain pure and devoted to You. May they give You Your rightful place on the throne of their heart. And finally, protect them from anyone who ever seeks to manipulate their heart for the wrong reasons. I love You God. Thank You.

DAY 12

A PRAYER FOR THEM TO WALK CLOSELY WITH GOD

Enoch walked faithfully with God; then he was no more, because God took him away. — Genesis 5:24

This is the account of Noah and his family. Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time, and he walked faithfully with God. — Genesis 6:9

***Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path.
— Psalm 119:105***

What does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God. — Micah 6:8

WHAT TO PRAY:

God, I pray that like Enoch and Noah, my child would walk closely with You. I ask that they would cherish their friendship with You. That they'd have a desire to talk to You, spend time with You, get to know You, and that when they have neglected all those things, that they would miss it dearly. Help me to show them what it means to walk with You. Empower me to seek You on my own, so that I can give them an example of how to do it. Give me the courage that I need to learn about You and have a hunger for Your Word. God, I need Your help to instruct them in the ways of Your Word because when I'm no longer here, Your Word will guide them and light their path. I trust You God, and I dedicate my child to You. Amen.

DAY 13

A PRAYER FOR RESILIENCE

I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do all this through him who gives me strength. — Philipians 4:13

Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. — Romans 5:3-5

Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing.

— James 1:2-4

WHAT TO PRAY:

Lord, as much as it pains me to say this, I know that my child is bound to suffer at some point. I pray that they don't, but I know that inevitably they will. I ask for Your protection, but I understand that bad things happen to good people. So with a humble and scared heart, I ask that You would build resilience within them. Make them strong, Father—not in their own abilities or confidence but rather in their faith. Your Word says, "The Joy of the Lord is my strength" – Nehemiah 8:10. I pray that this be true for my child. That they would find joy in their suffering, that they would see trials as a means of finding hope, and that they would remember that they can do all things through You! Amen.

DAY 14

A PRAYER FOR THEIR IDENTITY IN CHRIST

If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. — 2 Corinthians 5:17

***For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.
— Ephesians 2:10***

WHAT TO PRAY:

God, there are so many different ways to find purpose and identity. This world gives us so many different options for how we can define our own success, but I pray that my child would define themselves through their identity in Your son, Jesus. Remind them that their self-worth does not come from wealth, popularity, clothing, education, achievements, relationship status, or anything that people say to either praise or criticize them. Remind them that their identity comes from being a child of God. When the enemy accuses them of their sins, remind them that they've been redeemed. When they doubt whether or not they "have what it takes", remind them that when they are weak, You are strong. When they wonder why You'd ever allow bad things to happen to them, remind them that You've never forsaken them. And when they feel hopeless and helpless, send the right people to speak Your truth over them. Thank You for listening to this prayer. Amen.

DAY 15

A PRAYER FOR THEIR PROTECTION

The Lord will keep you from all harm—He will watch over your life; the Lord will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore. — Psalm 121:7-8

But the Lord is faithful. He will establish you and guard you against the evil one. — 2 Thessalonians 3:3

WHAT TO PRAY:

God, I pray for Your divine protection over my child in every area of their life. May they rest in Your care, trusting that You are their refuge and fortress, their ever-present help in times of need. Shield them from harm and danger both seen and unseen. When they leave our home each day, watch over their coming and going. Keep them safe in their travels, in their school, in their friendships, and in every interaction they have. Protect them from accidents, illness, and harm, and give them discernment to avoid situations that would endanger their well-being. Thank You, God, for being their constant watchman, never sleeping or growing weary. May they always know that You are near, watching over them with perfect love. I entrust them to You, knowing that Your faithfulness endures forever. In Jesus' name, Amen.

DAY 16

A PRAYER FOR THEIR PROVISION

And my God will supply every need of yours according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus. — Philippians 4:19

Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? — Matthew 6:26

WHAT TO PRAY:

Lord, I trust in You to provide for all of my child's needs. May they never lack anything necessary for life and godliness. Teach them to rely on You as their ultimate Provider, knowing that every good and perfect gift comes from Your hand. Fill their hearts with confidence in Your faithfulness, reminding them that You are always aware of their needs even before they ask.

Help them to see Your provision in every aspect of their lives—whether it's food on the table, a safe place to call home, or the relationships and opportunities You have given them. Remind them that just as You care for the birds of the air and clothe the flowers of the field, You will care for them even more because they are precious to You.

Lord, I also ask that You give them a generous heart. As they experience Your provision, teach them to share what they have with others in need. Show them that Your blessings are meant to flow through them as a reflection of Your love. Thank You for being the Provider who never fails. In Jesus' name, Amen.

DAY 17

A PRAYER FOR WISDOM

If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given to him. — James 1:5

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and knowledge of the Holy One is understanding. — Proverbs 9:10

WHAT TO PRAY:

Father, grant my child wisdom to make godly decisions throughout their life. May they seek Your wisdom in all things and learn to rely on You as the source of all understanding. Teach them to discern what is right and true, and give them the courage to act upon it even when it is difficult.

May their heart be rooted in reverence for You knowing that the fear of the Lord is the beginning of true wisdom. Help them to see that wisdom is not found in the fleeting opinions of this world but in the eternal truth of Your Word. Surround them with wise counsel—friends, mentors, and leaders who will guide them toward Your will and encourage them to walk in righteousness.

Thank You, Lord, for being a God who delights in giving wisdom to those who ask. I pray that one day, my child would ask You for wisdom themselves. I entrust my child to You knowing that You will guide them in the way they should go and teach them to make decisions that honor You. In Jesus' name, Amen.

DAY 18

A PRAYER FOR BREAKING GENERATIONAL PATTERNS

Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us. — Galatians 3:13

If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. — 2 Corinthians 5:17

WHAT TO PRAY:

Lord, break any generational patterns or curses that do not align with Your will. May my child walk in the freedom that Christ provides, unburdened by the mistakes, sins, or struggles of the past. Thank You, Jesus, for redeeming us from the curse of the law by taking what was meant for us, so we could be free. Through Your sacrifice, You have given us the power to live as new creations, with the old ways gone and a new life begun.

Father, I pray that my child would not be bound by patterns of sin, fear, or brokenness that may have affected our family in the past. Break the chains of anything that hinders them from fully experiencing the abundant life You have for them. Whether it be addiction, anger, insecurity, pride, or any other struggle, I pray that these strongholds would be dismantled in the name of Jesus. Help them to recognize that their identity is not defined by their family's past but by who they are in Christ. I entrust my child to Your care, confident that Your promises are true and that Your Spirit is at work to bring freedom and renewal. In Jesus' name, Amen.

DAY 19

A PRAYER FOR THEIR FUTURE SPOUSE

Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave Himself up for her, that He might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word. — Ephesians 5:25-27

An excellent wife who can find? She is far more precious than jewels. — Proverbs 31:10

WHAT TO PRAY:

Father, prepare my child's future spouse to be a person of integrity, faith, and love. Let them be rooted in Christ and committed to living a life that honors You. Begin working in their heart even now, shaping them to reflect Your character in all they do. I pray that their future spouse will grow in wisdom and understanding, learning to seek You in every decision and trusting You in every season of life.

Father, I ask that You also prepare my child to be the kind of spouse who honors and loves well. Equip them with patience, understanding, and a heart that seeks to serve. Teach them to prioritize You in their life so that their relationship with their future spouse will be built on a firm foundation.

When the time is right, bring them together in Your perfect timing. May they recognize each other as gifts from You and commit to a relationship that is centered on Christ. Bless their union with unity, joy, and a shared passion for pursuing Your will. May their future marriage reflect Your love and point others to the beauty of the gospel. In Jesus' name, Amen.

DAY 20

A PRAYER FOR THEM TO BE FILLED WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT

Do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit. — Ephesians 5:18

WHAT TO PRAY:

Lord, fill my child with Your Holy Spirit, so they may walk in power, love, and self-discipline. May Your Spirit guide their thoughts, words, and actions, leading them into all truth and helping them to live boldly for You. Let their life be marked by Your presence, producing fruit that reflects Your character: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

Father, I pray that they will come to know the incredible power of Your Spirit at work within them. May they rely on the Spirit's strength in their weaknesses and trust in the Spirit's wisdom when they face difficult decisions. Empower them to be a bold witness for Christ, sharing the gospel with courage and compassion wherever You lead them.

Protect them from anything that would grieve or quench Your Spirit in their life. When the world tempts them to seek satisfaction in other things, remind them of the fullness and abundance that can only be found in You. May they never settle for anything less than Your best, and may Your Spirit always draw them back to Your presence when they stray.

I trust You to fill my child with everything they need to live a life that honors You. In Jesus' name, Amen.

DAY 21

A PRAYER FOR THEIR COURAGE

Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go. — Joshua 1:9

The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid? — Psalm 27:1

WHAT TO PRAY:

God, grant my child courage to face their fears and stand for what is right. May they walk in boldness, knowing that You are always with them. Strengthen their heart and fill their mind with the truth of Your promises, so they are not swayed by fear or discouragement.

When they face challenges that seem overwhelming, remind them that You are their stronghold and salvation. Help them to remember that with You on their side, there is nothing and no one they need to fear. Teach them to trust in Your presence and guidance, even when the path ahead feels uncertain or difficult.

Lord, I pray that they would stand firm in their faith, even in the face of opposition or temptation. Give them the courage to speak truth, show love, and act with integrity, even when it is not easy. Equip them with boldness to defend the weak, stand up for justice, and share the gospel with confidence and humility. May their courage be rooted in their identity as Your child.

I entrust my child to You, knowing that You will empower them to face every situation with confidence in Your presence and plan. In Jesus' name. Amen.

DAY 22

A PRAYER FOR COMPASSION

Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. — Colossians 3:12

Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you. — Ephesians 4:32

WHAT TO PRAY:

Lord, may my child be filled with compassion for others, reflecting Your heart in all they do. Let their life be marked by kindness, tenderness, and a willingness to see the needs of those around them.
